Hope Gangloff paints at the Cantor

Painter Hope Gangloff, Cantor Arts Center's first Diekman Contemporary Commissions Program artist, will inaugurate the new Artist at Work series by working on-site in the museum's atrium balcony (328 Lomita Drive, Stanford), where she will be painting a portrait of her friend and Cantor staff member Tammy Fortin.



The public is invited to watch Gangloff at work May 19-20 and 23-30. Her painting hours may vary, but she will definitely be at work from 11 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. on May 24, 25 and 26. Gangloff has also painted several other portraits to hang in the atrium, as well as selected key works from the Cantor's permanent collection to display alongside her own.

Gangloff, who's based in New York City, is known for her colorful, richly detailed portraiture and slices of everyday life.

The exhibition will be on display in the atrium through September and the completed Gangloff paintings will be on display through April 2018. Assistant Curator Jennifer Carty will hold gallery talks on May 25 at 1 p.m. and June 24 at 12:30 p.m. and there are public tours through the exhibition on Fridays and Saturdays at 12:30 p.m. and Sundays at 2 p.m.
