Marcia Kure at Officine dell'Immagine

Marcia Kure is an alumnus of the art school at the University of Nigeria, Nsukka, where artists like El Anatsui and Obiora Udechukwu, as well as curators like Olu Óquibe and Ugochukwu-Smooth Nzewi, trained. A key figure in this school's history was the modern pioneer Uche Okeke, who encouraged both teachers and students to draw from contextual visual cultures, including Igbo arts and performances, and nsibidi, a graphic writing system indigenous to southeastern Nigeria. Such influences feed into Kure's collages, as is evident in the 'Shifters and Monarchs' series, in which the existential and hybrid conditions of postcoloniality—as well as the lived experience of women through time—are expressed in figures whose forms are an amalgamation of imagery and materials that span histories, genres, and traditions.
