"The Rat Bastard Protective Association," at the Landing. The Rat Bastard Protective Association was a close-knit group of now well-known California artists including Bruce Conner, Jay DeFeo, Wallace Berman and Joan Brown — that worked together in a building dubbed "Painterland" in San Francisco. Anastasia Aukeman, who wrote a book on the group — <u>"Welcome to Painterland: Bruce Conner and the Rat</u> <u>Bastard Protective Association"</u> — has now organized a group exhibition that brings the group's works together for the first time since the late 1950s. *Opens Saturday at 6 p.m. and runs through Jan. 7. 5118 W.
