### Death of artist Sarah Charlesworth

Artist and photographer Sarah Charlesworth passed away on 25 June 2013 at the age of 66.

Born on 29 March 1947 in East Orange, New Jersey, the artist specialised in conceptual art and photography. She graduated with a Bachelor's Degree in Arts in 1969 from Barnard College, where she studied under the tutorship of Douglas Hueblel. Afterwards, she studied photography with Lisette Model at The New School. In 1975, along with Joseph Kosuth, she created *The Fox*, a magazine dedicated to art theory, which was published up to 1976. She was considered to be a member of "The Picture Generation", a group of artists who were active in New York at the end of the 1970s and the beginning of the 1980s. Work by these artists engaged with the perception of images, and their influence on both daily life and society on a whole.

Charlesworth's works feature in collections in several major international institutions, including The Brooklyn Museum, The Victoria & Albert Museum, The Israel Museum and The National Museum of Women in the Arts.
